# **My Voice Counts - SEND Youth Council**

We are extremely proud of our SEND Youth Council's achievements this term. They attended the first Milton Keynes Youth Summit, engaging with leaders and developing their debating skills. They also met with SEND Partnership Manager Mim Kendrick to inform thinking towards the new SEND Strategy, with the current

strategy due to come to an end this academic year. Members also had a very important vote on their name, which they agreed by majority to now be known as 'My Voice Counts' which I'm sure we will all agree is a fantastic and very fitting new name.

# **Ordinarily Available Provision**

We are excited to share that two important documents have been developed collaboratively by a range of stakeholders across Milton Keynes. This was an action of the Inclusion SEND Strategy Workstream.

These documents, called the "Ordinarily Available Provision", outline a comprehensive range of adjustments and provisions that could be provided as part of the ordinarily available support within schools and settings.

One document is specifically for early years, and the other is for school-age children. They serve as valuable reference points for all setting/school staff, helping them plan necessary adjustments and targeted support for students with additional needs. These documents explain provision that can be in place in settings and schools within what is known as the 'graduated approach' and would not require an Educational Health Care Plan to access.

# **Phase Transfer**

Phase transfer is when a child moves to a new stage of education. During this time, their Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan is reviewed to ensure it still meets their needs in the new setting.

The SEND team are in the process of finalising placements for September 2025 for children with an EHCP who are due to either:

- start school
- currently in Year 2 (attending infant school provision)
- Year 6

If you have a child/children in one of those year groups you will be receiving an email by the 15 February 2025 with their next provision named on the plan.

For any questions after receiving this notification, email <u>ehcp@milton-keynes.gov.uk</u>, and a team member will reply within 5 working days.
